

TEACHING PORTFOLIO AT THE UNIVERSITY OF LAPLAND

A teaching portfolio supplements the e-application and CV by presenting the applicant's teaching activities and teaching skills from the viewpoint of the sought position. Upon request, the applicant is to present written proof of all the issues stated in the portfolio.

The portfolio may be up to five pages long and it is made according to the following grouping and content descriptions.

1. Teaching experience and teaching development

- extent and diversity of teaching experience at the various levels of university education (bachelor's, master's and doctoral education) or in other educational institutions
- utilisation and development of teaching methods and technologies
- other relevant teaching experience in view of the position
- working as a teacher-in-charge and amount of teaching experience
- development of teaching and assessment and utilisation of colleague and student feedback in course development

2. Pedagogical education and thinking

- pedagogical thinking and its development
- teacher's pedagogical studies or university pedagogical studies
- other pedagogically relevant studies and courses

3. Thesis supervision experience

- scope and diversity of supervision experience
- supervision of bachelor's, master's and doctoral theses and the role in it (main, second or artistic work supervisor)
- number of theses and works supervised and completed (no name list of the authors is to be included)

4. Ability to produce learning material

- amount and diversity of university-level learning material
- digital learning materials and environments
- scope of use and availability of the material
- other relevant learning material in view of the position

5. Other merits earned in the field of education

- acting as a degree programme director or an executive group member at the various levels of university education
- specialist positions related to teaching
- participation in teaching development projects
- teaching-related research and publication and artistic activity
- teaching-related commendations, awards and development funding
- national and international collaboration
- other teaching and supervision merits

6. Teaching demonstration

- performance in previous teaching demonstrations
